The Dutch drug policy

- Reduce demand & supply
- Limit risks of drug use

- Production, possesion, selling, importing and expertorting drugs is illegal
- To use drugs is NOT an offence

Tolerance policy Cannabis (Soft drugs)

DIMS

- Drugs information and Monitoring System
- Appointed by the Ministery of Health
- Goal: gain insight in the market of illegal recreative drugs in the Netherlands and the changes that happen in that market.
- Most important questions:
 - Which substances are found on the illegal drug market?
 - What are the health risks of these substances?
 - What are the prominent trends and changes?

Why?

Ministry of Health wants to know what is happening on the illegal drug market to prevent damage to public health.

It is (officially) NOT a consumer service...









Cocaine alert

Currently extremely dangerous cocaine is being sold in Amsterdam.

Several tourists were hospitalized with life-threatening conditions after using cocaine bought on the street. Three tourists have died. So ignore streetdealers.

Research has revealed that the "cocaine" used was actually white heroin.

If someone faints or starts breathing superficially or is not breathing at all -

Call 112 for an ambulance!

You will not be arrested for using drugs in Amsterdam.

Call 112 for medical assistance & ambulance.

While you wait, keep the victim awake by walking or pinching the shoulder muscle.



Awareness campaign white heroin ends

The Amsterdam mayor, public prosecutor, police and Municipal Health Service have decided to terminate the awareness campaign for white heroin in the city. Next week the warning campaign of a street dealer who sold white heroin as cocaine, will be finished.

The immediate reason for this decision is the arrest last Saturday of a suspect who may be linked to selling white heroin to three Danish tourists in February 2015.

This arrest is not a guarantee that there will be no new incidents, but according to the police the risk is decreased. A second reason for the decision is that, over the past six weeks, no new incidents have occurred and there have been no reports of white heroin for sale.

The third and final argument is that a warning campaign by definition is temporary and should be used sparingly. This to prevent that the instrument loses its power.

Amsterdam remains alert

As a result of this decision the matrix signs in town will be turned off.

Numbers

- Warning issued in 15 countries
- 300 on- and offline news articles
- 35 matrix signs
- 375 board signs
- Posters at 1000 locations
- 90.000 flyers distributed
- 1.100 heroin test sold
- 200.000 views of facebook warnings
- 310.000 views drugsalert
- 109.000 views of youtube video
- 400.000 impression online push notification
- 15000 euro reward for tip to find dealer

Lessons

- A system for monitoring and reporting drugs related incidents
- Importance of having an expert team like red alert team
- A clear and non judgemental message
- A clear focus and priority: public health
